<p>Field Study Mr. Henske Mrs. Hoffman</p>	<p>Adventures and Beyond in the Middle School Field study program. This is a very hands-on program that focuses on expeditionary learning. Students will learn how to design projects, conduct field research, and collect data. Our problem-based learning approach focuses on the study of the cultures and ecosystems of the surrounding communities. Students need to be willing/able to camp, travel by canoe, swim, carry their own equipment several miles in a pack, and eat food you prepare yourself.
