The Swope Memorial Loan Fund

On Dec. 7, 1925, Mr. Gerard Swope established a loan fund with the Mercantile Commerce Bank and Trust Co. (now US Bank) as Trustee, in the amount of \$50,000 as a memorial to his parents because of the sacrifices they had made to educate their children. The purpose of the fund is to assist graduates of public high schools in attaining a higher education at any college or institution they choose.

Students who apply for this loan should understand that the amount borrowed should be repaid so others can benefit and continue their education. This is entirely a moral obligation to make repayment, assumed by the student at the time the award is accepted from the fund. Repayment may begin at any time, in small payments before and after college graduation or in larger payments whenever possible.

The Swope Memorial Fund is used primarily to enable the exceptional student to continue studies, which otherwise would be prevented due to lack of funds. The “exceptional student” is one who has impressed the committee with an above average ability, personality, and character, and has demonstrated the ability to benefit from a college experience.


TEEN SUMMER EMPLOYMENT
